From "The Rainbow People of God" Desmond Tutu

Often and often our people are filled with despair and they wonder, what have we done to deserve all this suffering? It is important for the Church of God to tell the people of God, "Hey, hey, hey! Our God sees. Our God hears. Our God knows and our God will come down and deliver us." And we say it. We say it—in South Africa-we say to them, "Hey, hey, hey! We are going to be free. We are not asking for permission from the rulers of our land. We know we are going to be free." And we say to our oppressors, we say to them, "Do you know what? We are being nice to you. We are inviting you to join the winning side. Come and join the winning side, because you have already lost." Therefore, we can stand upright with our heads held high. We don't apologize for our existence. God did not make a mistake in creating us. Our God hears. Our God cares. Our God knows and our God will come down to deliver his people. Our God will come to deliver his people, here, everywhere, in South Africa, today, maybe not today. Tomorrow? Maybe not tomorrow. But what can separate us from the love of God? Absolutely nothing can separate us from the love of God in our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. If God be for us, who can be against us!






DISCIPLESHIP


